# April Meeting was a "Fool's Paradise"

The meeting opened with President Josh Sherwin announcing that we had forty people in attendance, twenty-nine members and eleven guests. Among those guests were the previously mentioned members of Ring 96 all the way down from Seal Beach, California. They were George Reis, Kevin Papke, Judy Case, John Piercy, and Territorial Vice President, Cliff Gerstman. During the short business meeting, the Election Committee announced the Board of Director's proposed slate of officers for 2024-25, as required by the ring's by-laws. These were: for President, Josh Sherwin; VP of Entertainment, Mike Stilwell; VP of Membership, James Thayer; Sergeant-at-Arms, Mark Booth; Members at large, Misha Osinovskiy and Gary Salisbury. The position of Secretary had no nomination from the Board. These were suggestions from the Board of Directors and any member is free to nominate anyone who is an active member of Ring 76 in good standing for the elections to be held in June.

"Magic Mike" Stilwell, the VP of Entertainment, announced the upcoming events for the next few months (See What's Up! Page 4). It was then announced that this year's Installation Banquet would not be a catered affair as usual, but a potluck. After the announcements, there were two auditions, Micah Ortiz and Gracie Morgan. Congratulations to both of them for becoming the newest members of our ring.



With all business attended to, it was time for the entertainment. Our theme was the highly anticipated event, the "You Fooled Us" contest, a legally safe rendition of some other program we've heard was on TV, but with which we have no association.

First up was Greg Wauson who did a version of a cut and restored rope.







# Shavings from the Board

The April 22<sup>nd</sup> Board meeting started at 7 pm. President Josh Sherwin & acting secretary Sherry Luft were absent so the meeting was conducted by the V.P. of Entertainment and



Richard Ustick took over the duties of Secretary.

Mike Stilwell still needs strolling performers for afternoon shift of the June  $2^{nd}$  Wheelchair Regatta.

V.P. of Membership James Thayer reported we are up to 77 members. Dues are due in June and the membership will be reminded with an announcement in the newsletter. While the membership is strong, Gary Salisbury pointed out we need to get more young people involved. The problem is that our meetings are on a school night. It was suggested that we should concentrate on high school kids, although they are generally a transitory population at that age, going off to college or other service. It was noted that even if we lose them for this period they do come back and may become more active members in the future. It was also suggested we put ads in military newspapers encouraging attendance to meetings. Miguel Garcia reported on the current Treasury status, which is very healthy. Sergeant-at-arms Mark Booth reported 40 people at the last meeting: 29 members and 11 guests, slightly fewer than the month before. The meeting was seen as very enjoyable. Librarian Gary Salisbury then shared activity including donations and Plex server use.

First up for new business was the slate of officers the Board is required to present to the election committee, which was done at the April meeting. We are still in need of a candidate for secretary as Sherry has been filling in for this year. Member-at-Large Misha Osinovskiy indicated that some sort of automation process may be employed to record meeting events and transcribe them into minutes. While this may work for the Board meetings, it may not provide the information needed for Meeting Minutes. The Board decided to examine this possibility further. The Board is looking into some sort of collaborative effort to report on meeting events for the newsletter and the official documentation the Ring is required to produce. The problem is that Ring 76 needs a secretary and that avenue needs to be pursued further.

The next order of business was the next few meetings including the Stand-up contest for May, which is fully booked, Gracie Morgan's lecture in June, and the installation potluck in July. Gracie Morgan's biography will appear in the next few newsletters. Misha suggested we announce the next six months' themes to show we are an active ring. The Board agreed; this will be done on the ring website. August will be "bag night" and September will be the swap meet.

Newsletter editor Richard Ustick then put out his request for articles and information for the next newsletter. With that, the meeting was called to a close.

# Ex Libris

Welcome to Ex Libris, my monthly newsletter article about the IBM Ring 76 library in San Diego.

'Ex Libris' (Eh-cks LEE-breese), means 'From the Book'. Generally, you will see this term used on bookplates to denote that it came from the library of its owner. For example: "Ex Libris: Gary Salisbury."

This is where we talk about your library as well as do book and video reviews. Yes, your library! If you are a Ring 76 member in good standing, then this is your library! So be sure to stay in good standing by paying your dues on time.

Someone recently asked me, "What is the Ring 76 Library?" I responded, "It is currently over 1,000 volumes of magic books and magazines, all available for check-out. It is 261 magic audiobooks, 1,587 magic instruction videos, 85 full length magic movies, eight albums of magic music (some royalty free), 1,481 magic performance videos (many classics), 10 podcasts (over 2,000 episodes we co-host), 23 magic TV series, a photo warehouse (where we will save all our Ring 76 activity photos) and all this is available for streaming from the Ring 76 Magic Media Server. It is also a museum for a collection of historic Ring 76 memorabilia from one of our founders, Honest Sid Gerhart. It is a magical learning source unparalleled in the entire IBM organization and it is funded totally from donations and fundraising efforts that I have engaged in for your behalf."

# WHAT'S NEW AT YOUR LIBRARY?

#### **Library Donations**

This month we had donations from:

- <u>Jordan Johnson</u> donated a book and magic props which will be used for future door prize drawings. (valued at \$100)




## Caught Dead Handed (Book 1)

by Carol J. Perry

She's not a psychic--she just plays one on TV. Most folks associate the city of Salem, Massachusetts with witches, but for Lee Barrett, it's home. This October she's returned to her hometown--where her beloved Aunt Ibby still

lives--to interview for a job as a reporter at WICH-TV. But the only opening is for a call-in psychic to host the late-night horror movies. It seems the previous host, Ariel Constellation, never saw her own murder coming.

Lee reluctantly takes the job, but when she starts seeing real events in the obsidian ball she's using as a prop, she wonders if she might really have psychic abilities. To make things even spookier, it's starting to look like Ariel may have been an actual practicing witch--especially when O'Ryan, the cat Lee and Aunt Ibby inherited from her, exhibits some strange powers of his own. With Halloween fast approaching, Lee must focus on unmasking a killer--or her career as a psychic may be very short lived.



## Tails, You Lose (Book 2)

After losing her job as a TV psychic, Lee Barrett has decided to volunteer her talents as an instructor at the Tabitha Trumbull Academy of the Arts-known as "The Tabby"-in her hometown of Salem, Massachusetts. But when the school's handyman turns up dead under seemingly

inexplicable circumstances on Christmas night, Lee's clairvoyant capabilities begin bubbling to the surface once again. The Tabby

is housed in the long-vacant Trumbull's Department Store. As Lee and her intrepid students begin work on a documentary charting the store's history, they unravel a century of family secrets, deathbed whispers-and a mysterious labyrinth of tunnels hidden right below the streets of Salem. Even the witches in town are spooked, and when Lee begins seeing visions in the large black patent leather pump in her classroom, she's certain that something evil is afoot. But ghosts in the store's attic are the least of her worries with a killer on the loose.

There are a total of 13 audiobooks in this delightful series on the Magic Media Server.



# Herrmann's Book of Magic, Black Art Fully Exposed by Alexander Herrmann

Alexander Herrmann (1844–1896) was a prominent stage magician in the latter half of the nineteenth century. Born in Paris, the son of Samuel Herrmann, a German physician who also toured Europe as a conjuror, he was a second-generation magician. His stage career began at age eight when he joined his

brother's stage show. Herrmann later emigrated to the United States, where he became a naturalized citizen in 1876. He performed stage magic shows throughout the U.S. along with his wife, Adelaide Herrmann, who, after Alexander's death, continued to perform their trademark illusions until the age of seventy-five.

In this posthumous book, published in 1903, he reveals many of the secrets of the conjuror, from the fundamental sleight of hand skills of palming objects and vanishing and producing them, to the operation of famous illusions such as the disembodied head which speaks. While more than a century has elapsed since this book was published, many of the skills of the conjuror are timeless, and mastering the techniques in this thin volume will equip you to amuse your nieces and nephews, entertain dinner guests, and become an utter, tedious bore if you over-do it.



**The Mitford Secret** by *Jessica Fellowes* 

It's 1941 England and the Blitz is making life miserable for everybody. It's also Christmas and Debrah Mitford, the youngest sister, decides to throw a house party at Chatsworth, one of the most famous

of the stately homes. Those family and friends able to attend will gather for traditional festivities. One of the guests will be a psychic. Too bad she didn't see her own future because after she does her reading for the guests she is murdered. What might connect a twenty-year old case of murder and the murder of the psychic?

Time for a private detective to start investigating. Louisa was the Mitford's maid and she and her young daughter, Maisie is part of the house party. Louisa has left service and become a private detective and will later be joined by her husband, Guy. I won't say any more for fear of spoilers.



In 1873, at an abandoned château on the outskirts of Paris, a dark séance is about to take place, led by acclaimed spiritualist Vaudeline D'Allaire. Known worldwide for her talent in conjuring the spirits of murder victims to ascertain the identities of the people who killed them, she is highly sought after by widows and investigators alike.

Lenna Wickes has come to Paris to find answers about her sister's death, but to do so, she must embrace the unknown and overcome her own logic-driven bias against the occult. When Vaudeline is beckoned to England to solve a high-profile murder, Lenna accompanies her as an understudy. But as the women team up with the powerful men of London's exclusive Séance Society to solve the mystery, they begin to suspect that they are not merely out to solve a crime, but perhaps entangled in one themselves...




